Arkansas native, Ken Hatfield, has represented himself and the state of Arkansas with energy and integrity. From the time he graduated from the University of Arkansas in 1965 with a B.S. in Accounting, Ken has upheld a long and honorable reputation of service.

- ◆ *Lettered in football at the University of Arkansas in 1962, 1963, and 1964, and led the nation in punt returns in 1963 and 1964*
- ◆ *Was made Co-Captain of the National Championship Team in 1964 (11-0)*
- ◆ *Served in the US Army for two years and was discharged as Captain in 1968*
- ◆ *Was named All Southwest Conference Defensive Back, Academic 1st Team, and All American*

Ken went on to have an extensive coaching career spanning a 41 year period.

- ◆ *Assistant Coaching Career includes: two years at Army, three years at Tennessee, seven years at Florida, and one year for the US Air Force Academy*
- ◆ *Head Coaching career includes: five years at the US Air Force Academy, six years at Arkansas, four years at Clemson, and twelve years at Rice.*

Almost as long as his career in football, is Ken’s long list of honors he has received over the years - evidence of a life of honor and integrity.
